Albuquerque Public Schools shall strive to promote a safe, objective and encouraging academic environment in which students may explore and discuss a variety of ideas and opinions. Albuquerque Public Schools employees shall strive to act as objective educators and moderators in the study of issues that may be sensitive in a classroom. Albuquerque Public Schools shall strive to treat families as partners in the academic development of student ideas and opinions. Therefore, the superintendent, or his/her designee, shall provide a process by which students and/or parents/legal guardians' objections to presentations, units of study and instructional materials and resources may be reviewed and alternative academic opportunities may be provided to the student.
