FIRST GRADE

2 reams white copy paper (8.5 x 11)
\$4.50 cash to reimburse teacher for folders, notebooks, etc.
24 sharpened #2 pencils
1 box 48-count Crayola crayons
1 box 10-Count Crayola markers (classic colors)
1 box 12-Count Crayola colored pencils
2 large pink erasers
2 bottles Elmer's white glue (4 oz.)
1 pair Fiskars pointed scissors
1 set 8-count Crayola watercolor paints
1 large box Kleenex tissue (250 count)
Boys - 1 bottle of hand sanitizer (8 oz. or larger with pump)

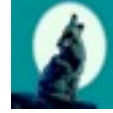

LBJ MIDDLE SCHOOL DRESS CODE



LBJ has adopted a uniform dress code for the safety and well being of all our students and staff. Please follow the dress code when on campus. Clothing worn to school should not violate the rules of decency, offend or intimidate others, promote unsafe conditions, or detract from the educational process. The **Dress Code** is in effect at all times on campus and all school related activities.

Clothing is to fit properly (i.e., not baggy or tight) and must be free from holes or frayed material. Company logos may be not more than 1-inch square in size. Clothing or personal belongings like jewelry, backpacks, purses, etc., which advertise, promote, or support alcohol, drugs, sex, violence, tobacco, or death are unacceptable. Clothing with professional or college sports team's names/logos are not allowed. **Current, fashionable clothing is not considered uniform dress. For example hip huggers, bell bottoms, skinny pants.**

***SHIRTS, SWEATSHIRTS, SWEATERS: Colors: White and Blue**

- **ONE Solid** (no layering) colored long or short sleeve polo style shirt with fold over collar, buttons, and banded sleeves. All polo shirts must button to the neck.
- **ONE Solid** colored long or short sleeve turtleneck (mock or regular).
- Shirts must not be tight or oversized.
- No logos over 1-inch square will be accepted.
- Polo shirt must cover belt and be no longer than finger tip length.
- **Solid** uniform color sweatshirt may be worn over a legal shirt. No **oversized** sweatshirts. No logos over 1-inch square.
- **Solid** uniform color knit sweater or vest (no embellishments) may be worn over a legal shirt.
- **2010-2011** 8th graders may also wear polo shirts.

***PANTS/SHORTS: Colors: Navy Blue, Black, and Khaki**

- Solid colored cotton twill dress pants/shorts are acceptable. (**NO denim of any color No corduroy**)
- Pants/shorts/capri pants must not appear to be tight. Underwear is not to be visible. No wide leg, baggy, dropped crotch, saggy, or "skaters" pants. Pants/shorts must fit properly at the waist, inseam, and the hem for boys and girls.
- Uniform pants/shorts/capri pants must fit and be properly stitched, no holes or frayed. Warm up pants are not allowed. **NO HIP HUGGERS – NO SKINNY PANTS.**
- Shorts must be at least fingertip length **NOT ABOVE FINGERTIPS** when arms and fingers are fully extended by side.

***SKIRTS, SKORTS, JUMPERS: Colors: Navy Blue, Black, and Khaki** Solid colored skirts, skorts or jumpers (**NO denim or corduroy**) may be worn.

- Skirts, skorts, and jumpers must be at least fingertip length **NOT ABOVE FINGERTIPS** when arms and fingers are fully extended by side.
- Wrap skirts are not allowed.
- Skirts with slits must have the slit at the side or back and slit must stop below the fingertips.
- Jumpers must be worn with both straps on shoulders

***FOOTWEAR:** Shoes of some type must be worn at all times. Flip flops, backless shoes, platforms, high heels, and sandals are discouraged. **Slippers are not allowed.**

***COATS AND JACKETS: Coats and jackets are not to be worn during classes and must be left in student's locker.** Solid uniform shirt color sweaters, vests, or sweatshirts (not oversized) are permissible. It is recommended that students leave an appropriate sweatshirt in their locker.

***OTHER:**

- Sunglasses, hairnets, bandannas, spiked accessories, chains are unacceptable.
- No long belts. Belts including the end of the belt must be in belt loops. No wallet-to-pocket chains.
- No hats on school grounds
- No pajamas at any time
- Any undergarments, including camisoles, must be tucked in and in a uniform color if visible at neck

***DRESS DOWN DAYS:** Students **MUST** wear uniform shirts and jeans -- solid colored, plain jeans.

- Jeans **MUST NOT** have any embellishments or side zippers.
- Students have permission to wear jean shorts and skirts on dress down day, following the uniform guidelines for appropriate length. Again, no embellishments or appliquéd pockets other than "standard" back pockets are allowed.
- Jeans must fit properly at the waist, inseam, and the hem for boys and girls.

***SPIRIT DAYS/DANCES**

- Members of the Student Council, Band, Orchestra, etc., may wear their organization's shirts when approved by the administration.
- Students may wear approved LBJ insignia shirts/sweatshirts on days that are approved by the administration.
- **School athletic uniforms are permitted on game days only.**

***EIGHTH GRADERS PRIVILEGE:** 8th Grade LBJ students will be allowed to wear for the 2010-2011 school year, purple polo shirts as their additional class color.

LBJ Middle School has adopted this Uniform Standard Dress Code for the safety and well being of all our students and staff. PLEASE NOTE that your student's failure to follow this dress code will result in missing valuable class time while they WAIT for YOU to bring them appropriate uniform clothing! Please assist your child in understanding and following the uniform policy. Following rules promotes good citizenship!
