Students should test according to the following protocol:

1. High school students take tests that align with their current courses. For example, a tenth grader in 11th grade ELA and geometry should take the 11th grade ELA and geometry PARCC assessments.
2. High school students not in PARCC-tested courses do not test PARCC in that subject (ELA or math). For example, a student in 11th grade ELA and pre-calculus should take the 11th grade PARCC ELA assessment but should not take a PARCC math assessment. An exception exists for students in math courses above the level of algebra II or who waived Algebra II and have not met math graduation assessment requirements. These students should take either the PARCC geometry or algebra II assessment.
3. High school students taking two PARCC-aligned courses should only test on the higher-level course. For example, a student taking geometry and algebra II will only take the PARCC algebra II assessment.
4. 12th grade students (students in their final year of high school) do not test PARCC in the spring.
