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And so just being out of extra helping hand who is the sunshine in somebody's

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day, it just it's a good feeling and it's just something that's kind of ingrained

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in me.

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He shares his mom with a lot of different kids.

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His mom is an emergency foster care provider. I have seen Chris give up his

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his time or change his schedule to play cards with these kids, to possibly tutor them.

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Every time I take a math test or something he's always in the back of my

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head telling me that, no that was the wrong answer you should have done it

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this way, he would show me how I think that yeah. I remember in the classroom

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four years ago he was always helping out the students, always helping whatever

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they needed help because honors geography was a very hard subject and so he was

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always helping out kids in that nature, too. And he came by just to like talk

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talk to me like I can get my mind off of finals and just kind of to calm me down.

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I think that was really helpful. He would go above and beyond what normal

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students wouldn't do on his own time, without any credit, just doing it just to

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do it just, to help out, he knew I needed the help. He's a fun goofy type kid who

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whose energetic, who laughs a lot, who just thinks outside the box and you know

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works really really well with others and especially adults, especially for his age.

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So mature, but he's also goofy. So he's just an extraordinary young man. He was

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always there for me when I needed a friend. This

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is a mentor that you can rely on.
