When asked what he wants for his students, coming back to class after a year of remote learning, Christopher Speck of Garfield STEM Magnet School replied, "I want my students to see themselves as scientists. If I do my job right, they will form their own questions, plan investigations, and draw conclusions from the data they gather. I want them to be curious about the world around them, to notice the interactions between facets of nature. I want them to fall in love with nature and protect it. Like any teacher I want my students to have happy, successful lives. My wildest dream has already been achieved in that some students have gone on to careers in education. I am thrilled for them regardless of their trajectory as long as they bring a positive presence to the world and those around them."

What about his fellow teachers? "There is no reset button for the previous year," he said. "Still, I hope we can move forward as a community. We will continue to provide effective and impactful instruction. I hope that we are not myopic to the kaleidoscopic challenges of the pandemic, and ambitious enough to address the challenges that will persist in the coming years."

Christopher Speck continues to build a reputation as one of the most dedicated and innovative teachers in APS. How do his innovative ideas become real educational experiences for students? He writes, "Foundation funding is an investment in students. They are a validation of teachers' ideas and hopes. It highlights the trust the community places in our efforts. Foundation funding is also a reflection of the mission and vision of its supporters. This inspires me because the funded projects are a piece of each donor. My main goal as a biology teacher is to give students a solid understanding of the natural world so they can protect it.
