The **Assessment and Implementation Committee** (represented by key members from the following departments) is responsible for the oversight, installation, and implementation of security protocols at all APS sites:

1. **APS Police** (security, law enforcement, threat assessment)
2. **Capital Master Plan** (assessment compilation/projected needs)
3. **Facilities Design + Construction** (design and construction of secure vestibules and other architectural security solutions)
4. **Maintenance & Operations** (installation of perimeter fencing and security door hardware)
5. **Information Technology** (tech installations, web security, and technology maintenance)
6. **Risk Management** (legal, code, equity compliance)
7. **Student, Family & Community Support Services (SFCS)** (counseling, nursing, mental health)
