


- APS received a total of 1,289 responses

Respondent Age




- The majority or 33% of respondents identified as age 40-49, followed by 30-39 at 25% and 50-59 at 19%





Program/Subject Ranking MC* - All





- “Cut Admin” includes all of Alice & Bruce King Educational Complex as well as school admin


Budget Information Source MC*


Budget Information Source Write In



First Impression of Budget MC*




- The majority or 48% of respondents think the District manages its resources but could do better followed by those who think the District has more money than it is allocating and should be spending more on programs for students at 40%

First Impression of Budget Write In




- Out of 202 responses, the majority or 48% of respondents would like APS to cut admin which includes all of Alice & Bruce King Educational Complex as well as school admin

Reduction Suggestions




- Out of 790 responses, the majority or 53% of respondents suggest cutting administration to reduce expenses
- Other includes 15 categories at less than 1% each

Additional Ideas to Balance Budget



- Out of 417 responses, the majority or 33% of respondents suggest cutting admin to balance the budget followed by 14% who suggest increasing revenue

Single Most Important Budget Concern



- Out of 833 responses, the majority or 16% of respondents consider increasing teacher pay their single most important budget concern followed by cutting admin at 14% and decreasing class sizes at 13%
