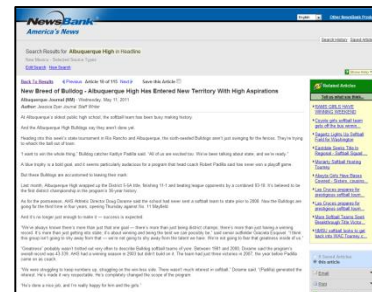

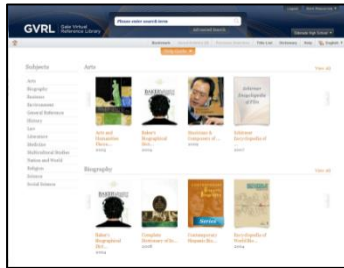
The NM State Library provides access to more than 30 databases; the six below are some of the best for middle school. Students can use them individually, or search them all at once with Powersearch.

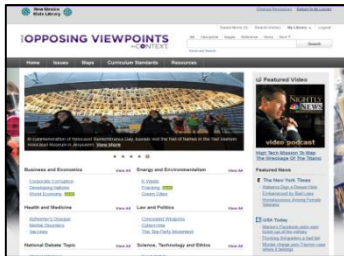

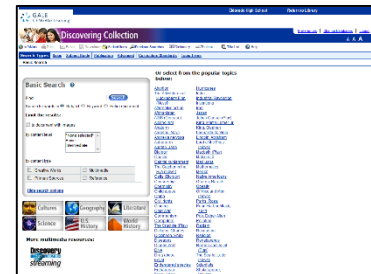
