

NM Math Tutoring Corps.

Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) impacts, if not addressed, could have severe short term and long-term social and economic implications for New Mexico families and our state as a whole. While there is an extraordinary, immediate, and widespread need to address learning loss as a result of COVID-19, there are far too many New Mexico students at risk of falling behind under ordinary circumstances. Research demonstrates that a strong predictor of high school dropout rates is whether or not students have been taught sufficiently to meet proficiency in English and math. The coordination and implementation of a tutoring program that supports the state's secondary students aligns with the purpose and mission of NMPED's Martinez/Yazzie action plan. A high-dosage tutoring program will address the immediate emergency as well as lay the groundwork for a long-term, sustainable strategy to improve educational outcomes for our most at-risk students.

The NMPED has trained tutors to support Algebra I students across New Mexico through virtual tutoring sessions. Our goal, is to serve a minimum of 1,000 students beginning January 2023. NMPED will manage all aspects of the project to include the planning, organizing, scheduling, and management of tutoring sessions.

New Mexico Public Education Department

School leadership will identify MLSS Layer 2 and Layer 3 students and submit a student referral spreadsheet with all eligible students. The NMPED will support with parent/family engagement, teacher communication, and scheduling. All teachers and guardians will have access to tutoring notes and be able to provide notes to tutors.

Personnel

Our goal is to serve 1,000 algebra 1 students that have been identified as needing Layer 2 or 3 intervention.

Focus

Students will complete a math foundational assessment. Additionally, interim assessments will be given every 3 weeks.

Tutors will be paired with students for the full tutoring period (January - April).
