Per §13-1-154.1 NMSA 1978, one (1) year contract, plus additional one-year extensions, not to exceed a total of three (3) years. Total contract amount not to exceed ten million dollars (\$10,000,000) over the three year period and any one purchase order under the contract may not exceed one million dollars (\$1,000,000).
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# **PROPOSER'S GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS**

1. **READ ALL DOCUMENTS.** Offerors must familiarize themselves with all documents contained herein; it is mandatory that all submitted offers be in compliance with all the provisions contained in the Request for Proposal.

The submission of a proposal constitutes a representation by the offeror that the offeror has made all appropriate examinations, investigations, and analysis and has made provision as to the cost thereof in his proposal. By responding to this RFP, Offerors acknowledge and agree to the terms and conditions set form in this RFP.

Offerors should promptly notify the buyer of any ambiguity, inconsistency, error, or missing attachments which they may discover upon examination of the RFP. Any response made by the District will be provided in writing to all Offerors by addendum, no verbal responses shall be authoritative.

Offerors may contact **ONLY** the buyer regarding the terminology stated in the procurement documents. Other APS employees do not have the authority to respond on behalf of APS. Offerors **MAY NOT** contact other district departments or employees. Any contact with a district department or employee may automatically result in a rejection of any proposal. Any other communication will be considered unofficial and non-binding. Communication directed to parties other than the buyer will have no legal bearing on this RFP or the resulting contract(s). Any response made by the District will be provided in writing to all Offerors by addendum, no verbal responses shall be authoritative.

Any contact during this RFP evaluation process, or attempt to have contact with the Evaluation Committee, where it is unsolicited by the Evaluation Committee's members, is grounds for disqualification of your offer.

2. **ELECTRONIC RFP DOCUMENTS.** This RFP is being made available by electronic means. In the event of conflict between a version of the RFP in the Offeror's possession and the version maintained by APS, the Offeror acknowledges that the version maintained by APS shall govern.
3. **FORMS AND ATTACHMENTS.** It is the responsibility of every offeror to ensure they have downloaded the latest version of each RFP, including any addendum(s) which may have been issued and posted on the APS Procurement Department Website. Offerors should revisit the website (<http://www.aps.edu/procurement> then select "See Current Bids and RFPs") prior to the due date before submitting their proposal to Albuquerque Public Schools. All addendums must be acknowledged in the submitted proposal.

Proposer shall submit one (1) original proposal, six (6) identical copies and one (1) identical electronic copy. Electronic copy is not email; please provide a Jump Drive loaded with your proposal. Fax copies are not accepted.

No Addendum will be issued later than SEVEN (7) days prior to the date for receipt of proposals, except an Addendum withdrawing the RFP or one which extends the date for receipt of proposals.

4. **CORRECTIONS.** Corrections shall be initialed in ink by the person signing the proposal.

Offerors will be allowed to withdraw their proposals at any time prior to the deadline for receipt of proposals. The Offeror must submit a written withdrawal request to withdraw their proposal. The approval or denial of withdrawal requests received after the deadline for receipt of the proposals is governed by the applicable procurement regulations.

The District reserves the right to add to or delete from the Scope of Work set forth in this RFP.

5. **PRICE IS ALL INCLUSIVE.** The proposal price shall be a delivered price. All materials shall be shipped F.O.B. Destination Freight prepaid as specified in the RFP.

All costs incurred by an Offeror in connection with responding to this RFP, the evaluation and selection process undertaken in connection with this procurement, and any negotiations with the District will be borne by the Offeror.

6. **BRAND NAMES.** Where a brand-name or equal specification is used in a solicitation, the use of a brand name is for the purpose of describing the standard of quality, performance and characteristics desired and is not intended to limit or restrict competition. If a vendor proposes an “equal” to scope of work/specifications, APS is the sole interpreter of the scope of work/specifications and sole judge as to whether the “equal” proposed complies with the scope of work/specifications.
7. **RFP PRICING DURATION.** Responses, including proposal prices, will be considered firm for one-hundred twenty (120) days after the due date of the proposals.
8. **EXPLANATIONS, EXCEPTIONS.** Any exceptions to the scope of work and/or specifications shall be listed separately in the submitted proposal and unless otherwise stated, specifications attached are the minimum requirements. Minor deviations to the specifications as listed, may be considered.

The buyer, after review of the proposals may request clarifications on information submitted by any and all offerors in a written format, with a specified deadline for response.

The District reserves the right in its sole discretion to waive minor informalities in proposals submitted provided that such informalities have no effect on price, quality, quantity, fitness, delivery or any matter to be evaluated in making a selection and confer no material advantage on the Offeror whose non conformity is waived.

9. **PREFERENCES.** Bids may be awarded preference in compliance with NMSA 13-1-21 for New Mexico In-State Resident Business and Resident Veteran Business. Bidders shall include in their bid a copy of the certificate issued by State of New Mexico Taxation & Revenue. If Bid is Joint Venture, Bidder shall state in submitted bid the percentage of work that will be performed by Resident Business and/or Resident Veteran Business. Please Note: A Bid cannot be awarded both a resident preference and a resident veteran business preference. Additionally, preferences are not applicable for federal fund purchases.
10. **TIMELY SUBMISSIONS.** Proposals must be submitted by the due date and time. Albuquerque Public Schools does not accept proposals electronically, by fax, or email, as a hardcopy with original signature must be submitted.

APS may in its sole discretion extend the time for the submission of bids upon a finding that it is in the interest of the District to do so. Such extensions shall be by addendum, which may be issued before the submission due date.

It is the offeror’s responsibility to ensure the proposal arrives before the due date and time. Offerors are cautioned that “late is late”. It is the responsibility of the Offerors to allow sufficient time for the hazards of traffic, weather, finding parking, locating the proper office, third party delivery, US Postal Service mail delivery, etc. Any and all proposals not received by the proposal submission due date and time shall be rejected. No late bids will be accepted under any circumstances, not even if the delivery company is late. It is recommended to send your bid early.

11. **RFP CANCELLATION OR REJECTION.** This RFP may be canceled or proposals may be rejected in whole or in part when it is in the best interest of Albuquerque Public Schools.

The District reserves the right to eliminate any Offeror who submits incomplete or inadequate responses or is not responsive to the requirements of this RFP.

12. **RFP OPENING.** Submitted proposals shall not be publicly opened.

Any sole response that is received may be rejected by the District depending on available competition and timely needs of the District. The District reserves the right to award the contract to the responsible bidders submitted responsive bids with resulting agreements most advantageous and in the best interest of the District.

The District reserves the right to eliminate any Bidder who submits incomplete or inadequate responses or is not responsive to the requirements of this Bid.

The Evaluation Committee may make such investigations as necessary to determine the ability of the potential Offeror to adhere to the requirements specified within this RFP. The Evaluation Committee will reject the proposal of any potential Offeror who is not a responsible Offeror or fails to submit a responsive offer as defined in NMSA 1978 13-1-83 and 13-1-85.

13. **NEGOTIATIONS.** The District reserves the right to discontinue negotiations with any selected Offeror.

The contents of the proposals shall not be disclosed during any negotiations that may occur. A public log will be kept of the names of all Offeror organizations that submitted proposals. Pursuant to NMSA 1978, § 13-1-116, the contents of proposals shall not be disclosed to competing potential Offerors during the negotiation process. The negotiation process is deemed to be in effect until the contract is awarded pursuant to this RFP. Awarded in this context means the final required District signature on the contract(s) resulting from the procurement has been obtained.

14. **MULTI-AWARD.** The District reserves the right to multi-award contracts as necessary for adequate delivery or service in accordance with 13-1-153 NMSA.

15. **AFTER AWARD.** It is mutually understood and agreed that the successful offeror(s) shall not assign, transfer, convey, sublet or otherwise dispose of the purchase order, contract, or his/her right, title of interest therein, or power to execute such purchase order or contract to any other person, company or corporation without the previous written consent of APS.

This procurement in no manner obligates Albuquerque Public Schools until a valid signed Price Agreement or valid Purchase Order is executed.

After final contract is negotiated, approved and awarded, all proposal documents pertaining to this procurement will be open to the public, except for the material, which is proprietary or confidential. The Procurement Department will not disclose or make public any pages of a proposal on which the Offeror has stamped or imprinted "proprietary" or "confidential" subject to the following requirements.

Proprietary or confidential data shall be readily separable from the proposal in order to facilitate eventual public inspection of the non-confidential portion of the proposal. Confidential data is normally restricted to confidential financial information concerning the Offeror's organization and data that qualifies as trade secret in accordance with the Uniform Trade Act, 57-3A-7 NMSA 1978. The price of products offered or the cost of services proposed shall not be designated as proprietary or confidential information.

16. **DEFINITIONS.** Definition of Terminology: This section contains definitions that are used throughout this procurement document, including appropriate abbreviations.

“Agency” shall mean Albuquerque Public Schools (APS)

“Award of Contract” shall mean formal approval by the Board of Education and a contract document has been signed by both parties.

“Contract” shall mean an agreement for the procurement of items of tangible personal property or services.

“Contractor” shall mean the successful bidder

“Determination” shall mean the written documentation of a decision of a procurement manager including findings of fact required to support a decision. A determination becomes part of the procurement file to which it pertains.

“Design Professional” shall mean architect or engineer.

“Desirable” the terms “may”, “can”, “should”, or “prefers” identify a desirable or discretionary item or factor.

“Evaluation Committee” shall mean a body of District employees or other representatives assigned to perform the evaluation of Offeror proposals.

“Finalist” is defined as an Offeror who meets all the mandatory specifications of the RFP and whose score on evaluation factors is sufficiently high to qualify that Offeror for further consideration by the Evaluation Committee.

“Mandatory” the terms “must”, “shall”, “will”, “is required”, or “are required”, identify a mandatory item or factor. Failure to meet a mandatory item or factor will result in the rejection of the Bidder’s bid.

“Offeror”, “Bidder”, or “Proposer” is any person, corporation, or partnership who chooses to submit a bid.

“Owner” shall be Albuquerque Public Schools.

“Purchase Order” shall mean the document, which directs a contractor to deliver items of tangible personal property or services pursuant to an existing contract.

“Request for Proposal” or “RFP” means all documents, including those attached or incorporated by reference, used for soliciting proposals.

“Responsible Offeror” shall mean a Bidder who submits a responsive bid and who has furnished, when required, information and data to prove that its financial resources, production or service facilities, personnel, service reputation and experience are adequate to make satisfactory delivery of the services or items of tangible property described in the bid.

“Responsive Offer” shall mean a bid, which conforms in all material respects to the requirements set forth in the Bid.

# **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**



1. **TERM:** APS reserves to right to procure the services/goods as described in this RFP and enter into a contract as described on RFP front cover.
2. **REQUEST(S) NOT DEFINED IN SCOPE OF WORK:** Contractor shall be held responsible to NOT fill requests which are clearly beyond the defined scope of this contract. Should such requests occur, contractor has the responsibility of calling such violations to the attention of the APS Procurement Officer.
3. **MINIMUM AMOUNT:** Albuquerque Public Schools does not guarantee a minimum amount of purchases in conjunction with award of this request for proposals.
4. **PRICING ESCALATION:** Price escalation will be considered only at yearly observance of award (anniversary date) and only upon receipt of written request from contractor stating reason for escalation and the amount being requested. Justifying documentation must accompany price escalation request.
5. **TAXES:** APS holds a Class 9 Nontaxable Transaction Certificate and is exempt from payment of taxes on tangible personal property. A NTTC will be issued upon request.
6. **NON-APPROPRIATION:** The District's obligation to make payment under the terms of this RFP is contingent upon its appropriation of sufficient funds to make those payments. If the District does not appropriate funds for the continuation of this procurement, this procurement will terminate upon written notice of that effect to the Contractor. The District determination that sufficient funds have not been appropriated is firm, binding and not subject to review.
7. **PROCUREMENT CODE:** The Procurement Code, Sections 13-1-28 through 13-1-199 NMSA 1978, imposes civil and misdemeanor criminal penalties for its violation. In addition, the New Mexico criminal statutes impose felony penalties for bribes, gratuities, and kickbacks.
8. **TERMINATION:** Either party may terminate this contract as follows:
  - A. Termination by the Contractor
    1. The contractor may terminate this contract only if Albuquerque Public School District fails to comply with any provisions of this contract and after receiving notice of the noncompliance the District fails to cure the noncompliance within ten (10) days, or
    2. By written mutual agreement between the Contractor and the District.
  - B. Termination by the District
    1. For Cause
      - a. The occurrence of either one of the following events will justify termination for cause:
        - i. Contractor's persistent failure to perform the work in accordance with the contract documents (including but not limited to, failure to supply sufficient skilled workers or suitable materials or equipment).
        - ii. Contractor's violation in any substantial way of any provisions of this contract.
      - b. If either one of the events identified above occur, the District may, after giving Contractor (and the surety, if any) ten (10) days written notice, terminate the service of Contractor, exclude Contractor from site, and take possession of the work. Contractor shall be paid for project costs incurred up to the date of termination but shall not be paid for loss of profits resulting from such termination.
      - c. Where Contractor's services have been so terminated by the District, the termination will not affect any rights or remedies of District against contractor then existing or which may thereafter accrue. Any retention or payment of moneys due the Contractor by the District will not release the Contractor from liability.

2. For Convenience

a. Upon ten (10) days written notice to contractor, APS may without cause and without prejudice to any other right or remedy of APS, elect to terminate the contract.

b. In such case, Contractor shall be paid (without duplication of any items):

i. for completed and acceptable work executed in accordance with the contract documents prior to the effective date of termination,

ii. for expenses sustained prior to the effective date of termination in performing services and furnishing labor, materials or equipment as required by the contract document in connection with uncompleted work.

c. Contractor shall not be paid on account of loss of anticipated profits or revenue or other economic loss arising out of or resulting from such termination.

9. **INDEMNIFICATION:** The Proposer shall be responsible for damage to persons or property that occurs as a result of his fault or negligence, or that of any of his employees, agents or subcontractors. He shall save and hold harmless Albuquerque Public Schools against any and all loss, cost, damage, claims, expense or liability in connection with the performance of the contract. Any equipment or facilities damaged by the Proposer's operation shall be repaired and/or restored to their original condition at the Proposer's expense.

10. **INSURANCE (If Applicable):** The successful proposer shall purchase and maintain statutory limits of Worker's Compensation, Public Liability and Automobile Liability insurance approved by APS at the time of contract award. Albuquerque Public Schools shall be included as a loss payee and/or additional insured. Public Liability and Automobile Liability insurance shall include at least the following coverage:

12. **AUDIT:** The District reserves the right to audit the contractor's records associated with this contract at any time during the contract period and for a period of up to three years following the expiration or termination of the agreement. Such audit may be conducted by District personnel or a third party under contract with the District. The District shall give the contractor reasonable notice prior to the conduct of any audit and upon receiving the notice from the District the contractor agrees to fully cooperate with the auditors. If contractor subcontracts any portion of its obligation to another party, contractor shall guarantee District's access to books and records of such party.
13. **INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR:** The Contractor is an independent contractor performing services for the District. The Contractor shall not accrue leave, retirement, insurance, or any other benefits afforded to employees of the District as a result of this procurement.
14. **PROCUREMENT UNDER EXISTING CONTRACTS:** In accordance with NMSA 13-1-129, proposers are hereby notified that other governmental entities within the State of New Mexico, or as otherwise allowed by their respective governing directives, may contract for services with the awarded proposer. Contractual engagements accomplished under this provision shall be solely between the awarded proposer and the contracting entity with no obligation by Albuquerque Public Schools
15. **DEBARMENT OR SUSPENSION:** A business (contractor, subcontractor or supplier) that has either been debarred or suspended pursuant to the requirements of 13-1-177 through 13-1-180, and 13-4-11 through 13-4-17 NMSA 1978 as amended, shall not be permitted to do business with the District and shall not be considered for award of the contract during the period for which it is debarred or suspended with the District.
16. **CONFLICT OF INTEREST:** By submitting a proposal, the proposer certifies that no relationship exists between the proposer and the District that interferes with fair competition or is a conflict of interest; and no relationship exists between such propose and another person or firm that constitutes a conflict of interest that is adverse to the District.
17. **NON-DISCLOSURE:** The proposer shall not disclose any information relating to students, and employees of APS other than such information that may be authorized by the individual student or employee. Vendor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless APS from any damages, claims, liabilities, and costs including reasonable attorney fees in the event any unauthorized release of such information occurs.
18. **DELIVERY:** The goods shall be delivered free of the rightful claim of any third person, any security interest or other lien. Unless otherwise agreed all goods called for in this Bid shall be tendered in a single delivery and payment is due only upon such delivery (NET 30).
19. **FOB:** Unless stated otherwise, the price for goods is FOB: Destination (District's designated address).
20. **DELAYS IN DELIVERY:** Time is of the essence and this purchase may be subject to termination for failure to deliver on time, unless delay was caused by APS. If delay in delivery is foreseen, Seller must notify the APS Requesting Department of late delivery, cause of late delivery and remedy for late delivery.
21. **INSPECTION:** Final inspection will be made at the destination upon completion of delivery of goods/services. Final inspection shall include any testing or inspection procedures required by the specifications.
22. **ACCEPTANCE:** Acceptance of delivery of goods/services shall not be considered acceptance of the goods/services furnished. Acceptance occurs when the Requesting Department, after a reasonable opportunity to inspect the goods/services, signifies to the seller that are goods/services are conforming and fails to make an effective rejection.
23. **BUYERS REVOCATION OF ACCEPTANCE:** Requesting Department can revoke acceptance of goods when it is discovered, in a reasonable time, that the Sellers non-conforming goods substantially impair the value of the goods.

25. **SELLERS RIGHT TO CURE A NON-CONFORMING DELIVERY OF GOODS:** The Seller, upon notice of revocation of acceptance, shall correct without charge and deliver conforming goods in a reasonable time
26. **ASSIGNMENTS:** The awarded Contractor shall not assign nor delegate specific duties as part of this RFP nor transfer any interest nor assign any claims for money due or to become due under this RFP without the written consent of APS.
27. **PAYMENT:** Any invoice received and payment made shall be subject to District's terms and conditions (NET 30) unless specifically waived by District in a separate written document and not this RFP or any response.

## **PROTESTS**

1. Any Offeror who is aggrieved in connection with a solicitation or award of an Agreement may protest to the Purchasing Office in accordance with the requirements of the Contracting Procurement Regulations and the State Procurement Code. The protest should be made in writing within 24 hours after the facts or occurrences giving rise thereto, but in no case later than 15 calendar days after the facts or occurrences giving rise thereto (13-1-172 NMSA 1978). The protest must be in writing and delivered to the Executive Director - Procurement Department, Albuquerque, New Mexico
2. In the event of a timely protest under this section, the Purchasing Agent and the Contracting Agency shall not proceed further with the procurement unless the Purchasing Agent makes a determination that the award of Agreement is necessary to protect substantial interests of the Contracting Agency (13-1-173 NMSA 1978).
3. The Purchasing Agent or his designee shall have the authority to take any action reasonably necessary to resolve a protest of an aggrieved Offeror concerning a procurement. This authority shall be exercised in accordance with adopted regulations, but shall not include the authority to award money damages or attorneys' fees (13-1-174 NMSA 1978).
4. The Purchasing Agent or his designee shall promptly issue a determination relating to the protest. The determination shall:
  - A. State the reasons for the action taken; and
  - B. Inform the protestant of the right to judicial review of the determination pursuant to 13-1-183 NMSA 1978.
5. A copy of the determination issued under 13-1-175 NMSA 1978 shall immediately be mailed to the protestant and other Offerors involved in the procurement (13-1-176 NMSA 19

# **SCOPE OF WORK**

# OVERVIEW

The Albuquerque Public Schools (APS) operates one hundred and forty-four (144) schools serving approximately 84,000 students within the boundaries of Bernalillo County NM.

# RFP SCHEDULE

The RFP Buyer will make every effort to adhere to the RFP Schedule as noted on front cover of this RFP. The schedule is subject to change by addendum. The evaluation committee may interview the Proposer(s) of the top rated proposals; however, contracts may be awarded without such interviews and based solely on written offers. Finalists will be contacted to schedule interviews if required. If an interview is requested, evaluation scores will be re-scored to reflect written response and interview response.

# SCOPE OF WORK

Albuquerque Public Schools (APS) is requesting competitive sealed proposals with the intent of entering into a contract with contractor(s) for the purpose of providing bituminous paving and related work and for plant hot mix materials. Miscellaneous work and/or materials may be added as necessary for a complete project. Work under this contract may include APS funded projects plus approved projects under the State of New Mexico Highway Department's Cooperative Programs and like paving projects funded by severance tax funds from the State of New Mexico, Bernalillo County, etc. Contractor must anticipate many relatively small jobs and must be prepared to mobilize and carry these to completion in a timely manner. **Emphasis on large jobs only will not be accepted.**

This RFP includes subcontractor listing requirements for those projects which exceed \$25,000.00.

All work shall comply with the latest edition of the New Mexico State Highway Department Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction manual (NMSHDSS). Where specified, the latest edition of the City of Albuquerque Standard Specification for Public Works Construction (CoA SSPWC) shall apply.

This is an indefinite quantity time and materials contract with work consisting of:

- Removals – Contractor shall furnish all labor, equipment, and tools necessary to complete required removal and disposal of materials. Materials shall be properly disposed of in compliance with EPA, City, County, etc. regulations. The contractor shall be reimbursed by APS for exact dumping fees only. No mark-up will be allowed. Copies of actual receipts must be submitted with invoices.
- Earthwork – Shall include all materials, equipment and labor to accomplish necessary lines, grades, and profiles indicated on individual job drawings and/or as specified by APS. All work shall conform to the NMSHDSS.
  - NOTE: Subgrade Preparation – Paving quotation includes 6” subgrade preparation. Paving pricing will be for complete in place job. References on the quotation pages to “Includes subgrade preparation” means that the contractor shall process and compact to 95% established laboratory density for traffic areas, 90% below pedestrian areas for subgrade materials that have a soil bearing value of 20 or more, 5” thick in compliance with NMSHDSS.
    - Cut/Fill, on Site: This applies to preparation beyond the normal 6” subgrade preparation.
    - Clearing and Grubbing: This applies to whatever materials/objects need to be cleared to complete specified job. It may include grass, sod, brush, rocks, etc.
    - Export and Disposal of Sub-base Material: The same requirements for “removals” stated above apply.
    - Import Sub-base Materials: This applies to materials having a soil bearing value of 20 or more.

- Sterilant Application: This item should include the cost of both materials and labor. APS FD&C shall instruct contractor when sterilants are to be used. If APS determines it shall be necessary to apply ground sterilants, application shall be per manufacturer's recommendations.
- Bases – Quotations are for an in place price including both materials and labor.
- Bituminous Paving – Shall include all materials, equipment and manpower to accomplish routine grading, spreading, and compacting plant mix bituminous base course to the lines, grades, thicknesses, and typical cross sections indicated on the drawings and/or as specified by APS. Bituminous Paving is not restricted to roadwork. Sidewalk installation and other applications (such as drainage swales) of unusual width may be included. Note that overlay pricing includes tack coat complete in place. Tack coat application shall comply with Section 407 of the latest edition of NMSHDSS.
- Crack Seal – Should APS elect to order only crack sealing, all work shall be quoted as complete and in place and conform to the latest edition of NMSHDSS.
- Bituminous Hot Mix (Product Only) – When materials are picked up by various APS Maintenance and Operations (M&O) personnel, they will be driving marked APS vehicles. No order shall be allowed without driver providing proper APS identification and providing the contractor with the proper price agreement number. APS designee will place order 24 hours in advance. In emergency situations, 24-hour advance notice may be impossible. Contractor will then fill emergency orders in the shortest possible time frame. Quantities will vary according to job size.

When materials are delivered, they will only be delivered to APS sites. Orders placed shall indicate quantity, site of delivery, price agreement number, and name of APS M&O employee placing the order. Also, the APS M&O employee receiving the order shall sign their full name on the delivery ticket. APS designee shall place order 24 hours in advance. In emergency situations, 24-hour advance notice may be impossible. Contractor will then fill emergency orders in the shortest possible time frame. Quantities will vary according to job size.

- Slurry Seals – Shall be a mixture of asphalt emulsion, mineral aggregate, mineral fillers, and water properly proportioned, mixed and spread on the pavement surface. Mixture shall be sufficiently free flowing to fill cracks in the pavement, and shall not segregate during application. Mixture shall also have a non-skid texture and adhere firmly to the surface. Mixing shall not continue for more than four minutes. Existing surface must be free of water and temperature must be at least XX degrees Fahrenheit, or as recommended by the manufacturer. All loose materials will be removed and the surface will be cleared of dirt, debris, etc. Surface cracks will be cleaned and blown own with compressed air. After material has been laid and is sufficiently set, it will be rolled until a uniformly smooth surface is obtained.
- Adjustment of Utilities – Contractor shall furnish equipment, labor, and materials required for a complete job.
- Parking Bumpers – Contractor shall furnish and install (to include anchoring) Portland Cement 8-inch parking bumpers.
- Concrete Curb and Gutter – Contractor shall furnish product similar to what is currently used by the City of Albuquerque. P.W. median curb and gutter, standard curb and gutter, or header curb and gutter and perform the installation. See city detail 2415. Concrete will be required to meet CoA SSPWC.
- Drainage Structures – Contractor shall furnish all labor, equipment, tools, and materials necessary to complete drainage work as specified. All work shall conform to governing standards.

Double “C” storm inlets to be constructed per the City of Albuquerque Drawing 2205. Double “D” storm inlets to be constructed per the City of Albuquerque Drawing 2206. Quote both single- and double-grated inlets for each type. The 18”x18” private storm inlet has only a single grate option.

- Signage – Signs shall be furnished and posted at the appropriate height for automobile/van handicapped parking and traffic control as required.
- Other similar types of work not listed here

It should be noted that all of the above items are covered under this contract only as they are required to complete a paving related project. The intent is to construct asphalt access roads, parking lots, and walkways and to extend the life of existing pavement by applying asphalt overlays, sealcoats, and crack seals on an as-needed basis. Some jobs may require related work such as removals, earthwork, concrete curbs, gutters, sidewalks, drive pads, striping, and drainage structures.

APS Maintenance crews perform patching repair and minor paving work requiring Bituminous Hot Mix (product only).

**Licensing Requirements:** The General Contractor and subcontractors shall comply with all licensing laws and regulations. The Contractor shall, as part of the proposal, provide copies of all of the Contractor's valid licenses necessary to perform the work in the State of New Mexico. Copies of the subcontractors' licenses need to be provided only if requested of the Owner.

**Codes and Permits:** All work shall be executed in accordance with local, federal, and state ordinances, and regulations governing the particular class of work involved. The contractor shall be responsible for final execution of work to suit these requirements. In the event of a conflict between the various codes and standards, the more stringent shall govern. The contractor shall hold harmless the Board of Education from liability of any kind arising from any failure to comply with codes and ordinances. Contractor shall secure all permits and licenses for the required work and shall pay all fees in connection with such permits and licenses. The contractor shall be reimbursed by APS for these permit fees only. No mark-up will be allowed. Copies of permit charge receipts must be submitted with invoices.

**Contract and General Conditions:** Offerors who are awarded work under this RFP will be required to enter into the most current edition of the APS Agreement between Owner and Contractor and accept the General Conditions of the Contract for Construction before beginning the first job under this contract. All work will be authorized through separate purchase orders which will detail the scope of work and compensation.

**Supervision:** The work shall be performed under the direction of a qualified foreman experienced in the trade who shall be thoroughly familiar with the complete requirements of a project and shall normally be present on the site during the execution of the work. The cost of such a foreman will be considered as a part of the contractor's overhead and may not be billed as a separate charge. If the foreman actually works on the site as a crew member **AND** has the authority to hire and fire personnel, his hours may be billed at the appropriate level. Estimating, takeoffs and the like will also be considered as overhead not to be billed separately.

**Project Management Software:** The successful Offeror shall purchase, at the Offeror's expense, one or more seat licenses for APS's Project Management Software, as needed for the General Contractor. Subcontractors are not required to purchase licenses. APS will provide training on the use of the project management software. Further, the successful Offeror is required to work with APS staff to ensure the all project communication, correspondence, submittals, change orders, pay requests, etc. are submitted, maintained and managed through APS's web-based Project Management Software.

**Subcontractors:** The Subcontractors Fair Practices Act applies to this procurement. Therefore, any request for substitution on the part of the Owner or the Offeror shall comply with this section. Since the award is made on a qualifications-based evaluation process, replacement of subcontractors after award and prior to contract execution may cause the Offeror to be disqualified.

**Wage Information:** the following information pertains to wage rates, subcontracting and taxation. Please read carefully:



**State Wage Rates:** It is the contractor's responsibility to acquaint himself/herself with and comply with State Regulations regarding payment of wages on public projects. Wage rates as established by the Department of Workforce Solutions will be paid by the contractor for every job performed under this contract for any project which is greater than \$60,000 on an individual basis. Compliance is a part of this bid. The contractor shall pay all mechanics and laborers employed on the site of the project, unconditionally and not less often than once a week, and without subsequent unlawful deduction or rebate on any account, the full amounts accrued at time of payment, computed at wage rates not less than those stated in the advertised specifications.

In the event it is found by the Department of Workforce Solutions, that any laborer or mechanic employed by the contractor or subcontractor on the site of a project covered by this contract has been or is being paid, as a result of a willful violation, a rate of wages less than the rate of wages required by the contract, APS may, by written notice to the contractor and his subcontractor (if the violation involves a subcontractor) terminate their right to proceed with the work, or such part of the work as to which there has been a willful failure to pay the required wages, and APS may prosecute the work to completion by contract or otherwise, and the contractor and his sureties shall be liable for any excess cost occasioned thereby. Any party receiving notice of termination of his contract or subcontract under the provisions of this section may appeal the finding to the Department of Workforce Solutions as provided in the Public Works Minimum Wage Act.

**Registration:** Pursuant to §13-4-13.1 NMSA 1978, any contractor, prime contractor or subcontractor wishing to be considered for award of any portion of a public works project greater than sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000) must be registered with the Department of Workforce Solutions as of the date the bid is submitted, or the bid shall not be considered for award of the contract. A bid submitted by a registered prime contractor that includes any subcontractor that is not registered in accordance with that section may be considered for award following substitution of a registered subcontractor for any unregistered subcontractor in accordance with Section 13-4-36 NMSA 1978. The substitution shall not be a basis for any increase in the bid price.

**Bonding Requirements:** The successful bidder, upon notification of the award of the contract shall deliver the required performance and materials/payment bonds in the amount of 100% for any project which exceeds \$25,000.00 (or satisfactory evidence that such bonds will be furnished within seven days). Bond must be satisfactory to APS, executed by a surety company authorized to do business in this state and said surety to be listed in Federal Circular 570 as published by the United States Treasury Department or approved by the State Board of Finance or the local governing authority.

The bonds provided to support any contract issued as a result of this solicitation shall protect Albuquerque Public Schools projects only. Any other entities utilizing said contract(s) under the provision of the Procurement Code Section 13-1-129 will need to require separate bonding.

Offerors shall be responsible for securing all applicable bonds, permits, including any plan checking fees as charged by any authority having jurisdiction over the projects for checking contract documents prior to obtaining a permit. Additionally, the Owner will not pay for insurance, business licenses, professional affiliations and similar costs of doing business which are the Offeror's obligation to secure and maintain. The cost of all bonding will be paid by the Offeror and will not be paid by the Owner. These costs are to be included in the Offeror's price proposal.

**Standards:** All work and materials shall comply with the recommendations and standards as set forth in the latest edition(s) of pertinent City, State, County and National Codes and Ordinances. Under the contract all work and products must be executed in strict accordance with the latest edition of NMSHDSS. The successful offeror will be thoroughly familiar with this document.

**Guarantee:** The contractor shall guarantee all materials, equipment and workmanship furnished and installed under this contract to be free from all defects and shall agree to replace at his/her expense, without expense to APS, any and all defective equipment, parts, etc., within 12 months after service is accepted by APS. This excludes normal maintenance and daily servicing of equipment which is the owner's responsibility.

**Safety:** The contractor shall take all necessary precautions to protect the site occupants from hazardous conditions. The contractor shall abide by all Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) regulations and all State of New Mexico Environmental Improvements Board Occupational Health and Safety regulations that apply to this contract. The contractor shall defend, indemnify, and hold the Board of Education and its agents, officers, administrators, and employees free and harmless against all claims, loss, liability, and expense resulting from any alleged violations) of said regulations) including, but not limited to, fines or penalties, judgments, court costs, and attorneys' fees. The contractor also shall be responsible for damage to persons or property that occurs as a result of his fault or negligence, or that of his employees and/or agents, in connection with this contract.

**Workmanship:** All personnel working under this contract shall be properly licensed in compliance with current applicable codes and regulations governing this type of work.

**Protection of Adjacent Surfaces:** The contractor shall take all measures necessary during the course of delivery to protect existing property including adjacent surfaces, equipment, electrical systems, piping, sidewalks, and landscaping from damage and shall repair promptly any such damage at his own expense and to the satisfaction of APS.

**Protection of the Work:** The contractor is responsible for the protection and security of all materials, tools, equipment, and installed work until the final acceptance of the work by APS designee.

**Interrupting Services:** The contractor shall coordinate the execution of all work in order to minimize interference with the operations of existing systems during construction or repair work. Connection to existing systems requiring the interruption of service within the building shall be carefully coordinated with the Project Manager to minimize system down times. Absolutely no interruption of the existing services will be permitted without the prior approval of APS.

**Clean-up Following Completed Work:** All materials, associated debris, and surrounding areas must be cleaned prior to acceptance of performed work.

**Inspections:** The appropriately authorized APS personnel may inspect projects at any time with or without prior notification to the contractor. APS designee will inspect work performed and materials used under this contract. APS shall have the right to interrupt work for spot checks or inspection purposes. Should any work be contrary to specifications or any requirement of the contract documents, the APS designee may order it corrected. The contractor shall correct all such work at his own expense. Any work or materials installed contrary to the requirements of the contract documents or rejected as defective by APS shall promptly be removed, replaced, or corrected as may be applicable. Any cost involved will be borne by the contractor.

**Specifications Deviation:** General Specifications are binding. However, in instances where there is a deviation between the General Specifications and the Job Specifications, the Job Specifications or the more stringent shall rule. On any job where there is doubt as to the process of installation to be used, the final decision will be made by the APS Project Manager, or designee.

**Testing:** Tests required shall be in compliance with requirements set forth in the latest edition of the NMSHDSS.

Should the contractor challenge APS secured test results and desire additional testing, the contractor shall arrange and bear the expense of the re-testing.

**Promotional Gifts and Activities:** APS Policy prohibits the distribution of jackets, shirts, caps or any other clothing items with company or product logo or any other form of advertising to its employees. Furthermore, APS employees are prohibited from entering drawings, contest or other promotional. /advertising activities with vendors or potential vendors in connection with a procurement action.

# MATERIALS

**Materials Supply and Quality:** All materials shall comply with applicable product standards set forth in the latest edition of the NMSHDSS and/or with specifically stated specifications within this contract.

**Ground Sterilant:** Shall by Hyvar XL or equal as approved by EPA.

**Aggregate:** Mineral aggregate will consist of durable sand and/or crushed stone. Mineral fillers shall conform to ASTM D-242 requirements and shall be considered part of the blended aggregate and only used when required in minimum amounts to improve the characteristics of the aggregate emulsion mixture. Smooth textured sand of less than 1.15% water absorption shall not exceed 50% of the total combined aggregate. Test per ASTM D-2419 shall have sand equivalent of not less than 45%. Abrasion loss per ASTM C-131 shall not exceed 35%.

**Bases:** Base course aggregate shall conform to the requirements of section 304 of the latest edition of the NMSHDSS. Fine aggregated base course shall comply with ASTM D 1073. Course aggregate base course shall comply with ASTM D 692. Provide available mix evaluation data with their proposal.

**Bituminous Paving:** Shall be plant mix bituminous pavement conforming to the requirement of the latest edition of Type II – grading B&C in the NMSHDSS. Contractor shall submit mix designs for both B & C Type II with their proposal.

Bituminous materials shall be quick setting, anionic emulsion and shall provide a homogenous mix with good suspension of aggregate particles.

**Crack Seal:** Shall be rubberized asphalt cement meeting the requirements set forth in the latest edition of the NMSHDSS.

**Tack Coat:** Shall be CSS-1 or SS-1 emulsified asphalt as per the latest edition of the NMSHDSS.

**Asphalt Curb:** Shall be approved Bituminous Mix.

**Bituminous Hot Mix and Hot Mix Fines (Product Only):** Mix design shall be the same as for Bituminous Paving previously stated in this section.

**Riprap:** Riprap will be classified as Dry Riprap (Class A or Class B), Grouted Riprap (Class A or Class B), Derrick Stone Riprap, Wire Enclosed Riprap, Grouted Wire Riprap, or Rock Plating. All riprap materials shall conform to the latest NMSHDSS.

**Drainage Pipe:** PVC Drainage Pipe shall be SDR-35 and Corrugated Metal Pipe will be 16 gauge.

**Procurement of Other Materials:** APS reserves the right to procure any materials through normal procurement channels and to furnish such materials to contractor for installation. Materials, so procured shall not be marked up by the contractor in any manner.

Installation shall be in strict accordance with the recommendations of the manufacturer or as may be required by code. If such recommendations conflict with plans and specifications, the contractor shall report such conflicts to APS. Changes shall be made as mutually agreed or necessary.

**Specialized Equipment:** Because the nature of the contract may involve use of additional equipment/parts or minor subcontracted work outside the general scope of the contract, but necessary for a complete job, the contractor is required to establish the pricing which will apply. Identify the charges that will apply for all items, indicate pass-through contractor's cost, discount from list, no charge, cost plus or an hourly rate as may be applicable. If an item is not priced, it will be assumed to be included in the contractor's overhead. Listed equipment shall not exceed prevailing rates for rental equipment. Equipment will be added or deleted at the time of contract renewal or upon request by the district. (Note that small tools, tape, miscellaneous screws and similar small items are to be in the contractor's overhead.) **(Form on page 41.)**

## **PRICE PROPOSAL – VOLUME 1 - DETAILED REQUIREMENTS**

### **ITEM 1 - PRICE PROPOSAL FORM:**

1. Price Proposals shall be presented in the form provided herein.
2. The proposal, bearing original signatures, must be typed or hand-written in ink on the Price Proposal Form.
3. Proposal price shall not include state gross receipts or local options taxes. Taxes will be included in the Contracted Amount at prevailing rates as a separate item to be paid by Owner.
4. In submitting this proposal, each Offeror must satisfy all terms and conditions of the Proposal Documents. All work covered by this Request for Proposals shall be in accordance with applicable state laws and, if price proposal amount is \$60,000 or more, is subject to the minimum wage rate determination issued by the office of the NM Work Force Solutions Department for this project. If the price proposal amount of the contractor or any subcontractor exceeds \$60,000, the contractor and/or subcontractor must comply with the registration requirements pursuant to the NM Work Force Solutions Department Registration Act.
5. Before submitting a proposal, each Offeror shall carefully examine the RFP; and shall include in the proposal the cost of all items required by the RFP. If the contractor observes that portions of the Contract Documents are at variance with applicable laws, building codes, rules, regulations or contain obvious erroneous or uncoordinated information, the contractor shall promptly notify the specified APS Representative and the necessary changes shall be accomplished by addendum.

### **ITEM 2 – NOTARIZED DECLARATION LETTER FROM SURETY:**

**ITEM 4 - RESIDENT CONTRACTOR (OR VETERAN RESIDENT CONTRACTOR) PREFERENCE CERTIFICATE:**

It will be the sole responsibility of any Proposer claiming a Resident Contractor Preference or Veteran Resident Contractor Preference to apply to the State of New Mexico Department of Taxation and Revenue for the proper certification and to receive approval, a certification number, and a certificate prior to the date and time for receipt of Proposals. Requests for qualification as a Resident Contractor or a Veteran Resident Contractor after receipt of Proposals will not be considered.

1. To receive a resident business preference, a business or contractor shall submit with its bid or proposal a copy of a valid resident business certificate or valid resident contractor certificate issued by the NM Taxation and Revenue Department.
2. When a public body awards a contract using a formal request for proposals process, a resident contractor shall be awarded the equivalent of five percent of the total possible points to be awarded based on the resident contractor possessing a valid resident contractor certificate.
3. To receive a veteran resident contractor preference, a contractor shall submit with its bid or proposal a copy of a valid veteran resident contractor certificate issued by the NM Taxation and Revenue Department.
4. The preferences do not apply when the expenditure includes federal funds for a specific purchase.

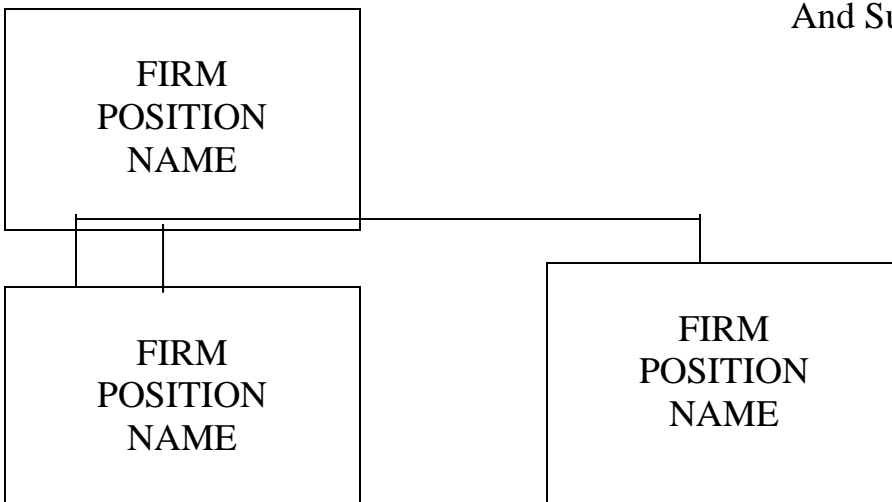

**“Campaign Contribution”** means a gift, subscription, loan, advance or deposit of money or other thing of value, including the estimated value of an in-kind contribution, that is made to or received by an applicable public official or any person authorized to raise, collect or expend contributions on that official's behalf for the purpose of electing the official to federal, statewide or local office. “Campaign Contribution” includes the payment of a debt incurred in an election campaign, but does not include the value of services provided without compensation or unreimbursed travel or other personal expenses of individuals who volunteer a portion or all of their time on behalf of a candidate or political committee, nor does it include the administrative or solicitation expenses of a political committee that are paid by an organization that sponsors the committee.

**“Family member”** means spouse, father, mother, child, father-in-law, mother-in-law, daughter-in-law or son-in-law.

**“Pendency of the procurement process”** means the time period commencing with the public notice of the request for proposals and ending with the award of the contract or the cancellation of the request for proposals.

**“Person”** means any corporation, partnership, individual, joint venture, association or any other private legal entity.

“**Prospective contractor**” means a person who is subject to the competitive sealed proposal process set forth in the Procurement Code or is not required to submit a competitive sealed proposal because that person qualifies for a sole source or a small purchase contract.

“**Representative of a prospective contractor**” means an officer or director of a corporation, a member or manager of a limited liability corporation, a partner of a partnership or a trustee of a trust of the prospective contractor.
